ONE BIG BEAUTIFUL BILL ACT

This year, Republicans passed historic legislation that will cut taxes for small businesses and working families, as well as secure Medicaid for future generations. But what if Democrats were successful in blocking it? Small businesses and working families would be worse off.

Passed (Reality)

If Democrats Blocked It



Lower tax rates are locked in for pass-through small businesses, fostering growth on Main Street. Tax rates would have increased for pass-through small businesses.



The 20% small business deduction is made permanent, allowing entrepreneurs to continue creating economic opportunity.

The tax benefit for Main Street would have disappeared.



Restores 100% immediate expensing for capital equipment, incentivizing small business growth and job creation.

The tax incentive, which has phased out since its initial implementation in 2018, would have disappeared completely.



No taxes on tips and overtime gives hospitality and other hourly workers a pay bump.

Workers would have continued to pay taxes on gratuity and overtime.



Reins in Medicaid with modest work requirements and extra checks to ensure benefits are going to Americans who need it. Medicaid spending would have continued to skyrocket unchecked, threatening the program's survival.
